

ADDITIONAL NOTE ON JOHN LEVI

After that season ended (1924) and the infamous first game for the Hominy Indians against Fairfax, John left the Osage and apparently signed a baseball contract with the New York Yankees. For spring training (1925) he was in spring training at St. Petersburg, Florida. The Yankees sent him to Harrisburg in the New York-Pennsylvania League. We was doing well with a batting average of around .300 and a high slugging average.

In August of that same year, John quit the team and returned to Haskell. When asked, he merely said that he got "homesick. He never went back to baseball, but went to the Hominy Indians as a player-coach. Also, he was on staff at Haskell for several years.
