Dear Sir:

The Hominy Indians desire a game with your club. They have been organized for ten years and have won all home games, and have lost to but six teams, the Memphis Tigers, N. Y. Giants, St. Louis Gunners, Boston, St. Louis Blues, and Tulsa Oilers. We defeated Memphis Tigers on our first two appearances, which drew record gates. We beat N. Y. Giants on Barnstorming Tour twice; played Boston A.C. 14-13; St. Louis Gunners twice, 14-13, 7-0; played Tulsa Oilers, an American League Team, 14-3, Tulsa scoring and beating us in the last five minutes of play at Tulsa.

Our club offers an unusual drawing attraction, owing to their color, enormous size and their war-like appearances on the playing field, such as war crys and gobbles, and odd names such as Knife Chief, Wy-num-bra, Chief Red Eagle, Chief Bull Face, etc.

In our line up we have Firpo Willcox, a 240 lb. tackle, a former N. Y. Giant Tackle; Dave Bible a 240 lb. guard; Siecha McCombs, a 335 lb. center with experience in the National League and a line that will average 305 lbs. to the man. Our back field will average 190 lb. to the man, with Taft Hanita, a 240 lb. fullback; Chief Morrell, a 245 lb. fullbac, who kicks the football seventy yards. We also have Whitey Shelton, former Memphis Tiger Star and Sam Colvin, a boy that was formerly with Louisville, and Chief Hendricks, a new boy who is rated by us as our most valuable man.

We will appear in Dallas a day before the game for publicity; will appear on the radio and give a war dance song and several Indian songs. This program has been one of our big factors in drawing unusually large gates. We could bring our club to Dallas for Seven Hundred Dollars Guaranty or an option of forty per cent gross gate. We will also assist in every way possible to make the game a financial success.
